Responding to comments by prominent GAA TV commentator Joe Brolly TUV leader Jim Allister said:

"The remarks by Joe Brolly underscore just how foolish Peter Robinson was in attending last night's event and praising the GAA for supposedly reaching out across the divide.

"Mr Brolly's remarks more than suggest that when it comes to outreach it is a one way process with the GAA lapping up the praise of foolish Unionist politicians but refusing to do anything to address the issues which cause many Unionists to see the GAA as a deeply sectarian organisation which continues to glorify and defend IRA genocide.

Joe Brolly's Comments Highlight DUP Disconnect

"Kevin Lynch was a suicidal terrorist who was serving ten years in prison for stealing guns and taking part in punishment shootings.

"The INLA, of which he was a member, murdered over 100 people.

"If Mr Brolly is "proud" his local GAA club is named after such a character it is a revealing insight into the attitude of the GAA as an organisation.

"The GAA can send representatives on to the media who will say all manner of things to cover up the truth but Mr Brolly has let the mask slip. He has exposed the folly of Mr Robinson's actions last night and proved that the GAA are not in the least interested in reaching out to the Unionist community.

"I have uncovered that between 2006/07 and 2010/11 the GAA received almost £18 million of tax payers' money. That was more than twice as much as football and dwarfs the mere £708,187 which rugby clubs received over the same period.

"Given that the GAA is in receipt of such generous sums of public money, what clubs are called is very much an issue on which every taxpayer in Northern Ireland has a right to comment."



Commenting on the announcement by the Special EU Programmes Body that it is to reallocate the funds earmarked for the Maze, Jim Allister said:

"Ever since Peter Robinson was forced into his U-Turn on the Maze Conflict Centre I have consistently made the argument that the EU funding earmarked for the project should be redistributed to deserving projects as soon as possible.

SEUPB Decision on the Maze Welcome

"I am delighted by the news that the Special European Programmes Body (SEUPB) has today announced that the money will be reallocated. I trust, however, it is spent wisely and not on some other unmeritorious schemes.

"Monday week ago I had asked Mr Robinson about how this £18m, which hitherto was to be wasted on the Maze, but he was more interested in making scurrilous and irrelevant allegations against me and my wife's family, than in discussing this serious issue.

Jim Allister continued:

"Now that the letter of offer on the Maze has been rescinded! Republicans need to get over themselves and let true economic development be the driver at the Maze site.

"The U-turn by the DUP has demonstrated the power of public opinion and how disconnected they were to think they could get away with gifting a terror-shrine to Sinn Fein.

"I am delighted to have played a role in that, and will continue to be vigilant."

"It goes against the DUP leader's nature to admit he's wrong but in this case he should man up and say sorry. His behavior isn't appropriate for a backbencher, let alone First Minister."

O'Dowd's Agenda is to Close Rural Schools

TUV Leader Jim Allister has hit out at the threat to rural primary schools posed by John O'Dowd's review of the Common Funding Formula and, in particular, his plan to withdraw the Small Schools Subsidy.

In a statement Jim Allister said:

"The sectarian dimension of the minister's approach is obvious, in that his reform of Common Funding the Formula will hit the controlled sector hardest, but an additional element, which has not had the attention it deserves, is his plan to abolish the Small Schools Subsidy. This will devastate many smaller rural schools. These are schools which make a vital contribution to our educational provision and mix.

Why is Gerry Kelly Above the Law?



Commenting on the ability of Gerry Kelly to avoid arrest, Jim Allister commented:

"Previously this week I called for the PSNI to recover the profits from Gerry Kelly's book about the breakout of terrorists from the Maze under the Proceeds of Crime Act.

"Following an interview on the Nolan Show today I have now written to the Chief Constable calling on him to investigate Kelly under Section 5 of The Criminal Law Northern 1967 Ireland Act for withholding information about an arrestable

offence, namely the shooting of prison officer John Adams on the night of the escape.

"When asked repeatedly who shot the officer in the head Kelly refused to answer and merely said he was acquitted of the offence in court. That is no bar to a further prosecution which is why he is ducking and diving.

"However, it is interesting to note that in a BBC documentary about the escape some years ago Kelly recounted how he told Prison Officer Adams: "Don't fing move. Get on the ground. This is an IRA operation. If you move I'll shoot. If you do what I tell you to do you won't be hurt". A voice over later in the documentary said "Kelly fired two shots. One of which hit Adams above the eye" (see http:// www.youtube.com/ watch?v=cc7WMJqHDcY).

Photographer Expense Keep Secret for Year and a Half

TUV have exposed another waste of tax-payers money, Jim Allister elaborates:

"Some months ago we learned that Stormont had awarded an estimated £400,000 contract split between six firms for the "provision of photographic services".

"As result of an Assembly year auestion last discovered that figures are "not available" for the years 2007/08 and 2008/09 and that for the three years from 2009/10 to 2011/12 a scandalous total of £349,740 was spent by departments on

photographs – over £100,000 a year!

"Now, one year and seven months after I asked the question, I have learned that since May 2007 £33,656.51 has been spent on photography provision outside Northern Ireland to the Executive. That may not be the entire figure as, in the case of two departments, Employment and Learning and Social Development, "figures (if any) are not available for the period." entire

"This figure seems grossly excessive, especially when put alongside the already significant sum paid for photographers in the Province.

"Doubtless many people will now wonder how much they paid for the photo when they see an Executive Minister beaming out at them from the pages of the paper.

"I am also aware that there are many journalists who are fed up getting their email inbox clogged up with an endless stream of photographs emailed out by executive press offices." **Dates for your diary**
